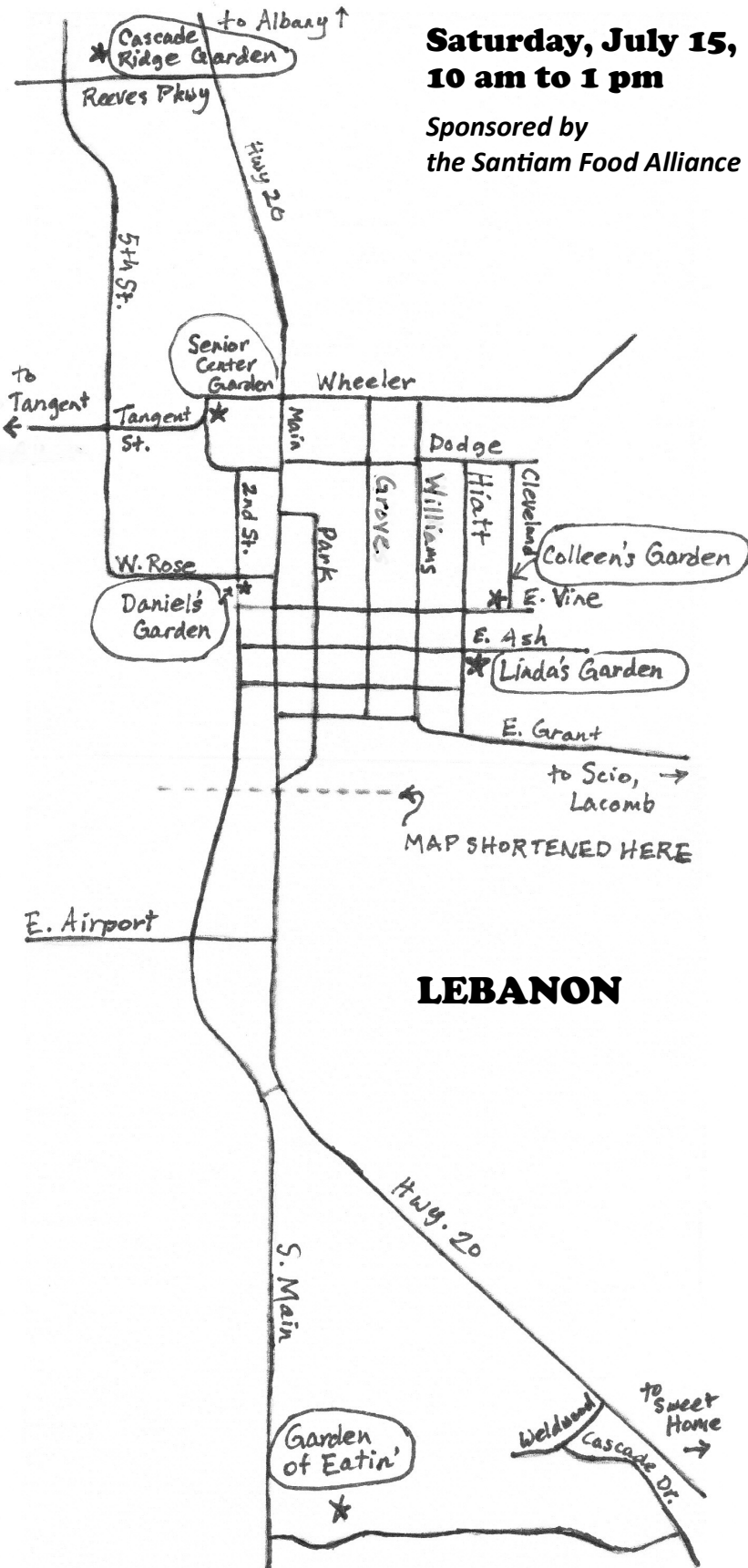


# Edible Front Yard & Community Garden Tour

## CASCADE RIDGE GARDEN Reeves Parkway and Fifth St.

This garden comprises 16 vegetable plots in 8 raised beds, with blueberry plants around the perimeter. Look for a fenced area at the northeast corner of the apartment complex. Park in any unnumbered space.

## SENIOR CENTER GARDEN 80 Tangent St.

Two 8-by-50-foot raised beds with timed watering provide plots for 20 seniors, who share gardening tips on the first Friday of the month at 10 am (all are welcome!).

## DANIEL KING'S GARDEN 94 West Rose St., at Second

Covering his small front and side yards and a curbside planting strip, Daniel's garden looks like a floral riot throughout the growing season. But intermixed with the flowers are plenty of edibles, including onions, radishes, cane berries, currants, gooseberries, fruit trees, and kiwi and grape vines.

## COLLEEN FLORO'S GARDEN 472 East Vine St.

In Colleen's front-yard garden you'll find peaches, blueberries, pears, rhubarb, raspberries, and vegetables as well as ornamentals. Notice the beautiful patch of lavender, a wonderland for the wandering bees.

## LINDA ZIEDRICH'S GARDEN 412 East Ash St.

Linda's newly-planted front-yard garden includes artichokes, strawberries, espaliered apples, and other fruit trees along with a clover-rich lawn. The curbside planting strips feature herbs, natives, and other drought-resistant plants, many edible.

## GARDEN OF EATIN' 3111 South Main, at Wagon Wheel

Adjacent to Our Saviour's Lutheran Church, this is Lebanon's biggest community garden. The mix of raised-bed and in-ground spaces are rented to community members for a minimal annual fee.
